



Computer Science, Mathematics & Computer Science 2025 Admissions Round Feedback

Please note this is subject admissions feedback from the 2025 selection round - there will be changes each year, and these pages only provide a general indication of process.

The Computer Science admissions tutors would like to thank all applicants for the time and care they put into their applications. We are also grateful to referees for proving their supporting statements and for the encouragement and support they give to applicants.

Computer Science and Mathematics & Computer Science continue to be among the most competitive courses in the University. The number of applications is considerably greater than the number of places available and, as a consequence, it's not possible to shortlist everyone for an interview. This year, there were 531 applications for Computer Science, 144 of which were shortlisted; 58 offers were made. In Mathematics & Computer Science, there were 564 applications, 206 of which were shortlisted; 90 offers were made. In Keble, the figures for Computer Science were 64 applications, 18 shortlisted, and 7 offers, including 2 offers made by other colleges. For Mathematics & Computer Science, there were 36 applications, 17 shortlisted (9 reallocated to other colleges) and 2 offers. All offers were for 2026 entry.

In their assessment of individual applications, the tutors took account of contextual data concerning relative individual and school performance as well as some background characteristics related to place of residence.
