## We can help with



### One-to-One Inductions

All students are given a library induction at the beginning of their time at Keble, but library staff can also offer one-to-one sessions.

## Access to the Building

Due to the nature of the library building, the Upper Reading Room is only available via stairs.

If the stairs present a problem for any users, arrangements can be made to study in the Lower Reading Rooms with entry via Liddon Quad.

## Access to the Collections

Books can be delivered to pigeonholes, left with Lodge staff or delivered directly to student rooms. Users with disabilities may also nominate a person to check out books on their behalf.

It may be possible to purchase extra copies of books for those who would find it difficult to visit other libraries & those who find it easier to read in their rooms.

## Equipment

Assistive equipment is available to borrow from the library desk while it is staffed - please ask!

- Book/laptop rests
- Coloured acetate sheets
- Magnifying glass
- Document holder
